



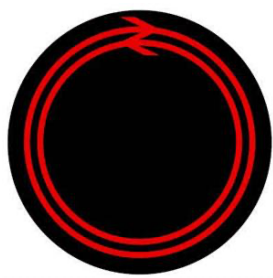

### Unauthorised use of clock design

I am writing on behalf of Network Rail. Network Rail is the owner of certain rights in the following clock design and variations thereof ("**Clock Design**"):



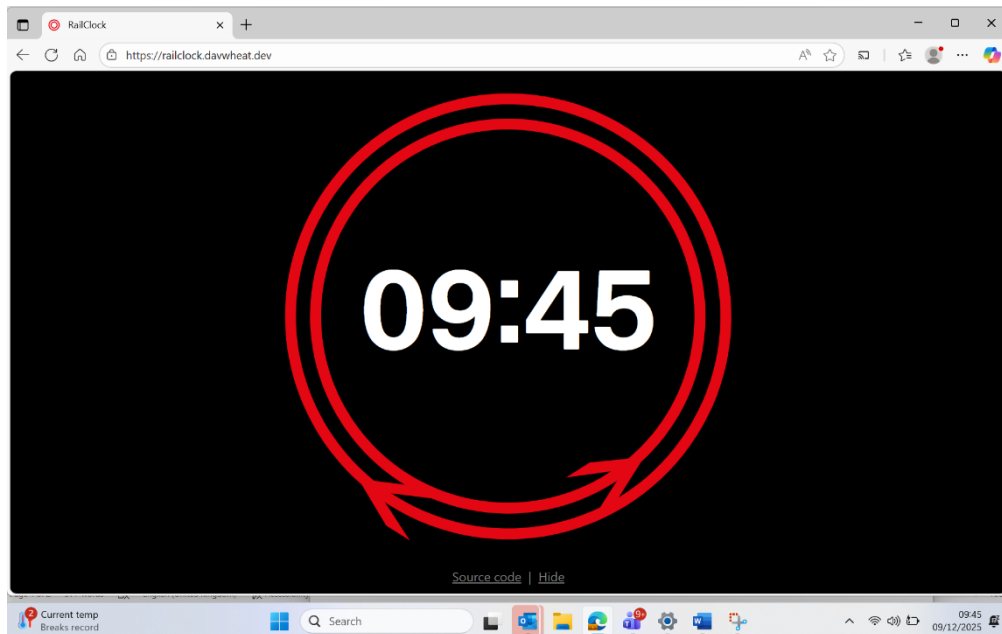
A further example of the design is set out below:



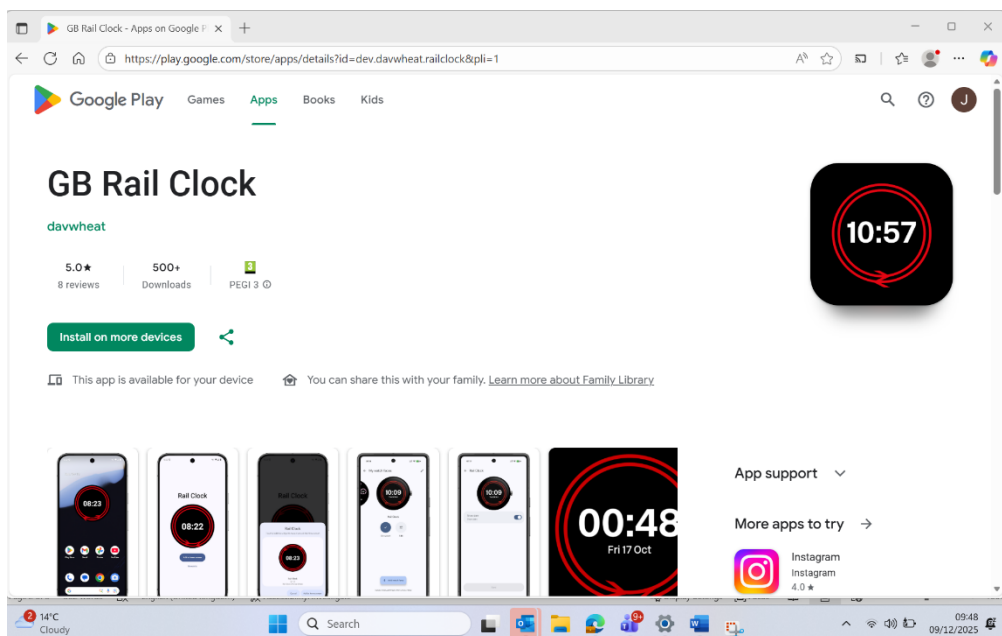
The Clock Design was created by the design agency Design Bridge and Partners in response to an international competition to celebrate 200 years of the modern railway run by Network Rail in partnership with the Royal Institute of British Architects and the Design Museum. The intellectual property rights subsisting in the design have been assigned to Network Rail.

The Clock Design is an important part of Network Rail's history and brand heritage.

It has come to Network Rail's attention that you are using a design ("**Infringing Design**") which substantially reproduces the Clock Design without Network Rail's permission. The Infringing Design is displayed at <https://railclock.davwheat.dev/> as per the below image:



In addition, the Infringing design is available for download via the Google Play store. A screenshot of the Infringing Design is shown below:



The reproduction of the Clock Design without Network Rail's consent amounts to the infringement of its copyright in the Clock Design pursuant to section 16 of the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988. Network Rail appreciates that you may not have been aware of its rights in the Clock Design, but, particularly in light of its importance to Network Rail's branding and history, it does not allow its unauthorised use.

By making the source code for the infringing design available via your website, you are assisting others to create their own infringing versions of the Clock Design. By facilitating others to download the infringing design via Google Play, you are facilitating its widespread distribution. This has the potential to cause significant damage to Network Rail, and may amount to authorisation of infringing activities by third parties.

In order to resolve this matter, Network Rail requests that you remove the Infringing Design and related source code from <https://railclock.davwheat.dev> & the Google Play Store (and any other websites where it is displayed) and confirm in writing within 14 days of the date of this letter you have done so, by sending an email to [REDACTED]. If we receive written confirmation that you have removed all iterations of the Infringing Design, Network Rail will not pursue any additional claims, damages or legal proceedings in relation to this issue.

We trust that you will understand why protecting its rights in the Clock Design is important to Network Rail and that this issue can be resolved swiftly and cooperatively.
